Maryland Covid-19 Vaccine Phased rollout

Phase 1 (limited supply) 3 sub-tiers 1a, 1b, 1c as determined by MD department of health

- Phase 1a
 - Healthcare workers
 - Residents and staff of nursing homes
 - First responders, public safety, and corrections
- Phase 1b
 - Assisted living, independent living, behavioral health and developmentally disabled group homes, and other congregate facilities
 - Adults age 75 and older
 - Education and continuity of government
- Phase 1c (current phase)
 - Adults age 65-74
 - Essential workers in lab services, agriculture, manufacturing, etc
- Phase 2
 - Adults age 16-64 at increased risk of severe Covid-19 illness due to comorbidities
 - Essential workers in critical utilities, transportation, food service, etc
- Phase 3
 - General population, including health adults age 16-64

Vaccine prioritization may be subject to change. The state adopted a rolling vaccine allocation model, meaning it may not wait for every member of a

particular group to be vaccinated before moving ahead. Individuals will still have the opportunity to be vaccinated in a subsequent phase.
